Oh, yes, he had one sheet and blanket to cover himself to keep warm and a small Christmas tree. It wasn't much, but it was his and he was grateful to CES' Jean's Closet for most of the items. The CES Community was at work.

During this season of giving and celebrating, others do not have the luxuries that many of us take for granted. Yet, **it is the small things that our clients appreciate.** It may be just a blanket, a can of soup and a can opener to open the can, a loaf of bread (without butter), some day-old fruit and produce, or an occasional half gallon of milk. Or, as one Meals on Wheels recipient experienced – a bed!

Marjorie, a previous **Meals on Wheels (MOW) client**, was reinstated after being successfully relocated into her own apartment from a stay at Avivo, a program that helps individuals who face complex barriers achieve stability and housing. As she talked to Rebecca (MOW staff) about starting her MOW delivered meals again, **Marjorie indicated that she was in need of a bed.**

The **CES Community** was already at work at another location. Rik, a volunteer, had mentioned to Linda, Director of Volunteer Engagement, that he had a bed
